Conferences, past and future

Albuquerque Press Women hosted the annual conference with great speakers in a beautiful place, the Bosque Conference and Retreat Center. The theme was "Shaping the Future of New Mexico: Our role as citizens and journalists." However, registrations were disappointing – Ghost Ranch was a tough act to follow, apparently – and NMPW lost money.

Next year, the meeting will be in Las Cruces. The theme for the conference on April 21-23, 2017 will be "Cuentos de la Frontera: Opportunities, challenges and responsibilities of telling stories on the border."

LCPW President Cassie McClure said that rather than using hotel conference rooms, the workshops will probably be spread across the historic and downtown area, with the banquet at a downtown restaurant.

2016 Zia Book Award winners announced

Author Denise Chávez received the 2016 Zia Book Award for fiction for *The King and Queen of Comezón*, her novel about the fictional border town of Comezón "Itch," New Mexico. The "Itch" refers to longstanding desires that will never be fulfilled.

"It is my manda, my mandate, to write about our borderland corridor and the stories that

inhabit our reality," said Chávez, who lives in Las Cruces.

Diane Thomas, of Santa Fe, was named first runner-up for *In Wilderness*, her novel set in the Appalachian Wilderness that explores the power of nature to heal.

Lisa Lenard-Cook, of Albuquerque, received an honorable mention for *Dissonance*, her reissued paperback novel about Anna Kramer, a Los Alamos piano teacher who inherits the journals of a composer and Holocaust survivor.

"Of my many novels, *Dissonance* is the one of which I am proudest," Lenard-Cook said in a written statement. "My intention for the book – that it explores love, war, prejudice and forgiveness without

The Zia Award is given annually to female authors who live in or have ties to New Mexico. Each year the contest focuses on one of three genres: fiction, children's literature or non-fiction. The 2017 Zia will be for children's books published in 2014, 2015, or 2016.

In Memoriam

Lisa Lenard-Cook died of ovarian cancer not long after her Zia Award was announced. Lisa was a well-known writer, teacher and NMPW member. Her novel *Coyote Morning* was also a 2007 Zia Book Award finalist.

Jessica Savage writes: "I'm the proud owner of three of Lisa's books, including an autographed copy of *Dissonance* in hardback. I'm very





saddened that this talented New Mexican woman author was taken from us at an age when many writers can

finally focus solely on their careers. We haven't heard the last of Lisa because she has, I believe, a memoir and a novel still to be published."

We were also saddened to learn that Lois Duncan had died in Florida. Lois, a conference speaker known to many members, died at home in Florida at 82. Tributes poured into her Facebook page.

Book Award stickers are available

The stickers don't have a date year, which means they can be used on books that were awarded in the past and perpetually into the future.

NMPW News

NMPW has 69 members of both NFPW and NMPW. Vice President Kathy Córdova reports that 54 members did not renew, primarily people who joined to enter the national contest. They'll receive follow-up letters.

Treasurer Peter St. Cyr reported total assets of \$31,774, but he expects a loss of more than \$4,000 for the year. Because most expenses were from subsidizing attendance at the national conference, this may be the last year NMPW pays half of member registration fees.

NFPW has set up a discount code of NEWMEXICO50 on NFPW's conference registration site. The conference is September 8-10 in Wichita, Kansas.

High School Contest Chair Chris Burroughs will be contacting teachers, helping students with their electronic entries, and rounding up judges. She needs your help.
